Conflict and resilience in Ukraine: Learning from lived experiences.

Project Leader. This 2-year project aims to strengthen knowledge and capacity in locally based police work in post-conflict situations, with a particular focus on Ukraine. Together with the Norwegian Police University College (PHS), and several Ukrainian partners, the project will link Norwegian and Ukrainian police and police students through new and existing courses in Norway to share experiences from Ukraine in policing in conflict, and support the teaching of ethics in policing in Norway and Ukraine. Funded by the Norwegian Higher Education and Skills Directorate (HK-dir).

Community-Based Policing and Post-Conflict Police Reform (ICT4COP)

Project leader for ICT4COP, a 5-year, EUR 5 Million Research and Innovation Action. With a team of over 35 researchers, and an extensive network of over 60 international police advisors, national police, and civil society organization members, the project studied community policing and post-conflict police reform in 12 cases across 4 continents. The research spanned from understanding local insecurities, national reform processes and international police advising

Courting Catastrophe? Humanitarian policy and practice in a changing climate.

In six case studies in African and South Asia, This project studied ways in which humanitarian aid can move beyond short-term emergency assistance to contribute to the prevention of catastrophes and long-term human security. As lead researcher for the Pakistan case, I led a team of local researchers in studying humanitarian response to the flooding in the context of conflict in the Swat Valley, and across Sindh. The results are available in academic articles, and were shared with national and international authorities in workshops and stakeholder meetings.
